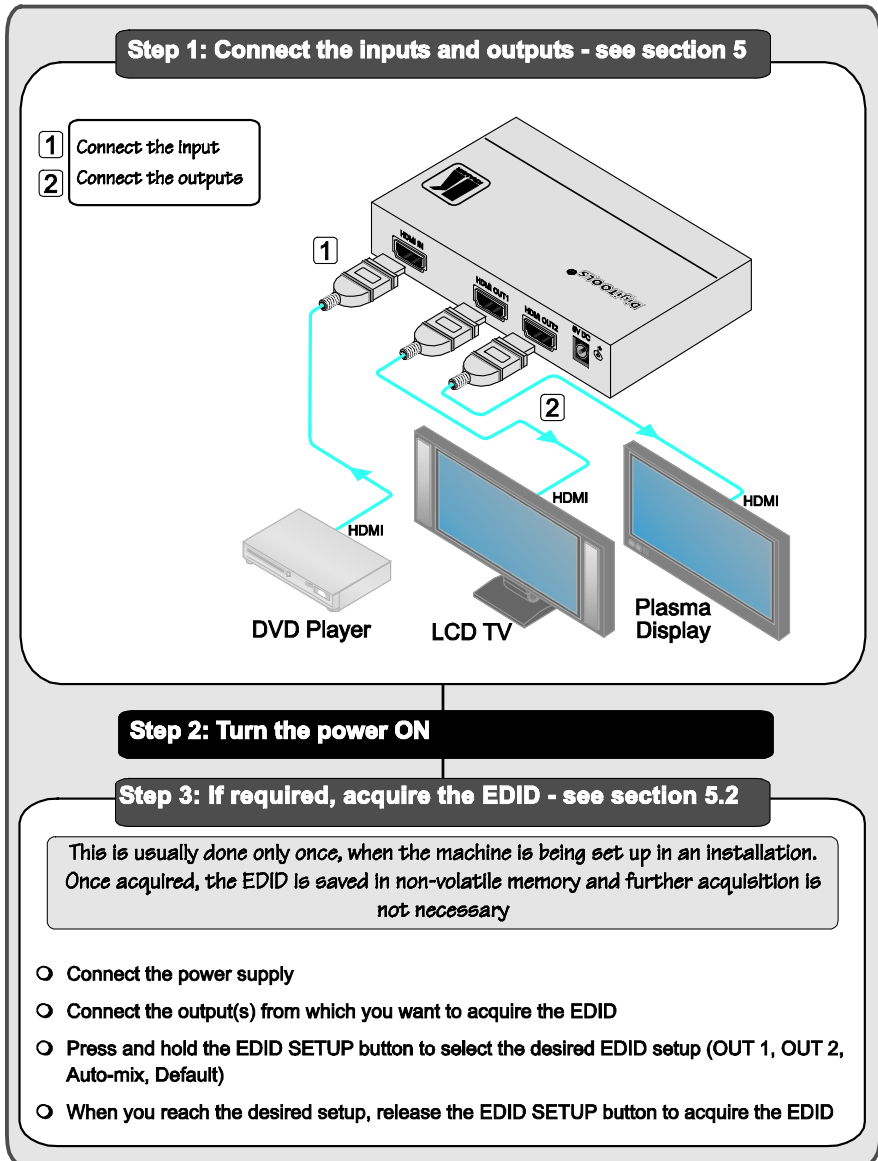

3 Overview

The high-quality **VM-2HxI** accepts an HDMI input and distributes the signal to two outputs. In particular, the **VM-2HxI** features:

- Up to 2.25Gbps bandwidth per graphic channel¹
- HDMI Support – HDMI (V.1.4 with Deep Color, x.v.Color™, Lip Sync, CEC)
- 3D pass-through
- I-EDIDPro™ Kramer Intelligent EDID Processing™, an intelligent EDID handling and processing algorithm that ensures Plug and Play operation for HDMI systems
- A default EDID for fast and efficient connection of the unit²
- 5V DC power

3.1 About HDMI

High-Definition Multimedia Interface (HDMI) is an uncompressed all-digital³ audio/video interface, widely supported in the entertainment and home cinema industry. It delivers the highest high-definition image and sound quality.

In particular, HDMI⁴:

- Provides a simple⁵ interface between any audio/video source, such as a set-top box, DVD player, or A/V receiver and video monitor, such as a digital flat LCD / plasma television (DTV), over a single lengthy⁶ cable
- Supports standard, enhanced, high-definition video, and multi-channel digital audio⁷ on a single cable
- Transmits all ATSC HDTV standards and supports 8-channel digital audio, with bandwidth to spare to accommodate future enhancements and requirements

1 Suitable for resolutions up to UXGA at 60Hz, and for all HD resolutions

2 Lets you use the EDID default value when no display from which to read the EDID is connected

3 Ensuring an all-digital rendering of video without the losses associated with analog interfaces and their unnecessary digital-to-analog conversions

- Benefits consumers by providing superior, uncompressed digital video quality via a single cable¹, and user-friendly connector
- Is backward-compatible with DVI (Digital Visual Interface)
- Supports two-way communication between the video source (such as a DVD player) and the digital television, enabling new functionality such as automatic configuration and one-button play

HDMI has the capacity to support:

- Existing high-definition video formats (720p, 1080i, and 1080p/60), as well as standard definition formats such as NTSC or PAL

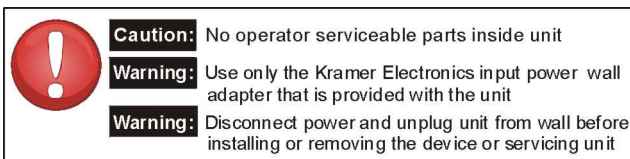
3.2 Defining EDID

The Extended Display Identification Data (EDID²) is a data-structure, provided by a display, to describe its capabilities to a graphics card (that is connected to the display's source). The EDID enables the **VM-2HxI** to "know" what kind of monitor is connected to the output. The EDID includes the manufacturer's name, the product type, the timing data supported by the display, the display size, luminance data and (for digital displays only) the pixel mapping data.

3.3 Recommendations for Best Performance

To achieve the best performance:

- Use only good quality connection cables³ to avoid interference, deterioration in signal quality due to poor matching, and elevated noise levels (often associated with low quality cables)
- Avoid interference from neighboring electrical appliances that may adversely influence signal quality and position your **Kramer VM-2HxI** away from moisture, excessive sunlight and dust

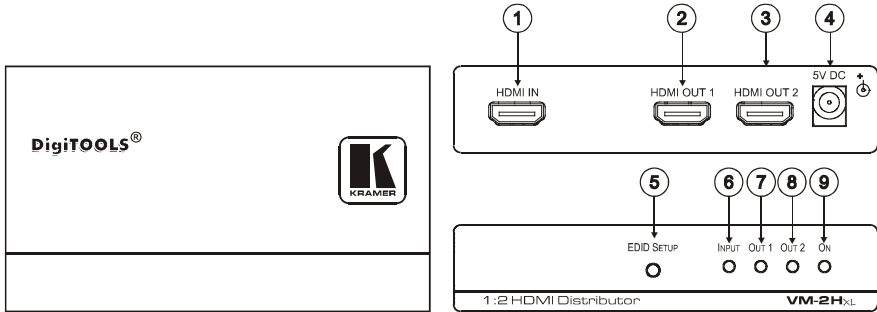


Figure 1: VM-2Hxl 1:2 HDMI Distributor

Table 1: VM-2Hxl 1:2 HDMI Distributor Features

#	Feature	Function
1	HDMI IN	Connects to the HDMI source
2	HDMI OUT1	Connects to the HDMI acceptor 1
3	HDMI OUT2	Connects to the HDMI acceptor 2
4	5V DC	+5V DC connector for powering the unit
5	EDID SETUP Button	Press for more than 3 seconds to acquire the EDID information from the display
6	INPUT LED	Flashes when the stored EDID does not match the display device EDID; illuminates when the EDID corresponds to the display device and that HDMI source is active
7	OUT1 LED	Flashes during the EDID setup; illuminates when output 1 is connected
8	OUT2 LED	Flashes during the EDID setup; illuminates when output 2 is connected
9	ON LED	Illuminates when receiving power

5 Using the VM-2Hxl 1:2 HDMI Distributor

This section describes how to:

- Connect the **VM-2Hxl** (see [Section 5.1](#))
- Use the EDID SETUP button (see [Section 5.2](#))

5.1 Connecting the VM-2Hxl 1:2 HDMI Distributor

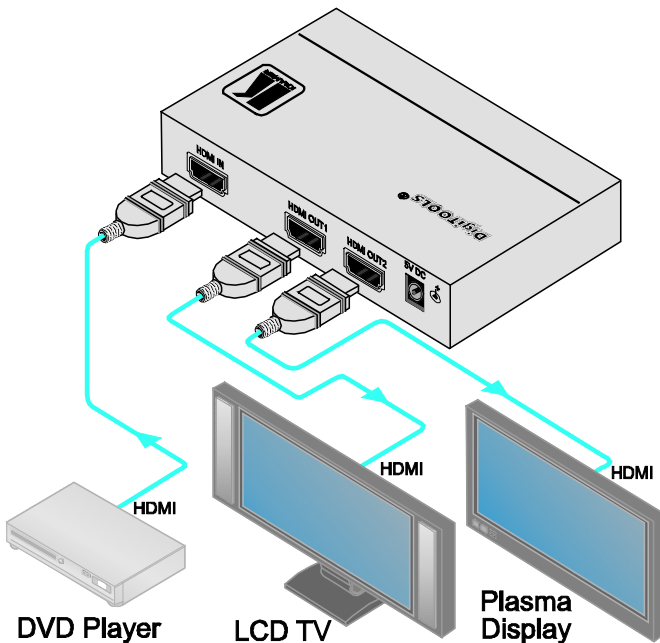


Figure 2: Connecting a VM-2Hxl 1:2 HDMI Distributor

To connect the **VM-2Hxl**, as the example in [Figure 2](#) shows, do the following¹:

1. Connect the HDMI source (for example, a DVD player) to the HDMI IN connector.
2. Connect the HDMI OUT connectors to up to two HDMI acceptors, as follows:
 - HDMI OUT 1 connector to an LCD TV
 - HDMI OUT 2 connector to a plasma display
3. Connect the 5V DC power adapter to the power socket and connect the adapter to the mains electricity.
4. Press the EDID SETUP button to acquire or change the EDID information (see [Section 5.2](#)).

¹ Switch OFF the power on each device before connecting it to your VM-2Hxl. After connecting your VM-2Hxl, switch on its power and then switch on the power on each device

5.2 Acquiring the EDID

Initially, the **VM-2Hxl** operates with the factory default EDID¹. This lets you connect the power before connecting one of the acceptors or sources.

You can acquire the EDID² from:

- One output (the relevant output illuminates)
- The default EDID (both output LEDs blink)
- Two connected outputs, the auto-mix mode³ (both output LEDs illuminate)

When pressing the EDID SETUP button briefly, the OUT LEDs indicate which type of EDID was last acquired. If the:

- OUT 1 LED illuminates, the OUT 1 EDID is stored in the non-volatile memory
- OUT 2 LED illuminates, the OUT 2 EDID is stored in the non-volatile memory
- OUT 1 and OUT 2 LEDs illuminate, the Auto-Mix³ EDID is stored in the non-volatile memory
- OUT 1 and OUT 2 LEDs blink, the Default EDID is stored in the non-volatile memory

To acquire the EDID, do the following:

1. Connect the power.
2. Connect the output or outputs from which you want to acquire the EDID.
3. Press and hold the EDID SETUP button to select the desired EDID.
The OUT LEDs illuminate in the following cycle: OUT 1, OUT 2, both illuminate (auto-mix³) and both blink (default).
4. Release the button when reaching the desired set up⁴.
The EDID is now acquired.

¹ The VM-2Hxl reads the EDID, which is stored in the non-volatile memory

² This is usually done only once, when the machine is being set up in an installation. Once acquired, the EDID is saved in non-volatile memory and further acquisition is not necessary

³ The EDID acquired is a weighted average of all the connected outputs. For example, if several displays with different resolutions are connected to the outputs, the acquired EDID supports all the resolutions, as well as other parameters included in the EDID

⁴ If you set the machine to acquire the EDID from an output that is not connected, the default EDID is acquired
